	Independently evaluates patients with complex pediatric dermatologic conditions. Independently manages patients
	with complex pediatric dermatologic conditions and/or comorbidities, with attention to age, weight, and
	psychosocial considerations. Independently performs basic procedures on pediatric patients using patient comfort strategies. (Level 4)

Milestone 3	Dermatologic Procedures and Surgery (PC3)
	Performs pre-operative assessment and counseling of risk for complex procedures. Performs excisions with layered
	closures; designs flaps and grafts where indicated. Identifies and manages procedural complications. (Level 4)
Milestone 4	Dermatopathology (PC4)
	Independently interprets microscopic features of common and uncommon disorders of the skin, hair, and nails. Independently performs clinicopathologic correlation for atypical or complex presentations. (Level 4)
Milestone 5	Cosmetic Care(PC5)
	Independently evaluates routine patient and recommends interventions to meet patient goals for cosmetic care.
	Delivers cosmetic treatment and manages complications, with assistance. (Level 4)
Milestone 6	Diagnostics(PC6)
	Independently selects, performs, and interprets a full spectrum of in-office tests. Independently interprets laboratory, imaging, and other diagnostic tests for complex or rare presentations. (Level 4)
Milestone 7	Critical Thinking/Differential Diagnosis(PC7)
	Pursues and synthesizes additional information to reach high-probability diagnoses with continuous re-appraisal.

Milestone 8	Therapeutics Management (PC8)
	Consistently identifies refractory disease and independently escalates therapy as necessary. Independently selects therapeutic modalities for common and uncommon skin disorders based on stepwise therapeutic ladders.

Milestone 10	Visual Recognition (MK2)
	Identifies variable presentations of uncommon and rare disease. Identifies subtle morphologic variability.
	Independently integrates visual diagnostic tools. (Level 4)

	Conducts analysis of safety events and offers error prevention strategies (simulated or actual). Discloses patient safety events to patients and families (simulated or actual). Demonstrates the skills required to identify, develop,
	implement, and analyze a quality improvement project. (Level 4)

	Leads effective coordination of patient-centered care among different disciplines and specialties. Advocates for care
	and effective transitions of care/hand-offs within and across health care delivery systems including outpatient
	settings. Participates in changing and adapting practice to provide for the needs of specific populations. (Level 4)

Challenges own assumptions and consider alternatives in narrowing the gap(s) between expectations and actual performance. Uses performance data to measure the effectiveness of the learning plan and when necessary, improves it. (Level 4)

Milestone 16	Professional Behavior and Ethical Principles (PROF1) Recognizes situations that may trigger professionalism lapses and intervenes to prevent lapses in self and others. Recognizes and uses appropriate resources for managing and resolving ethical dilemmas, as needed. (Level 4)
Milestone 17	Accountability/Conscientiousness (PROF Mitigates situations that may impact others' ability to complete tasks and responsibilities in a timely manner. Implements strategies to enhance accountability of team members involved in patient care.
Milestone 18	Self-Awareness and Help-Seeking (PROF3) Independently develops a plan to optimize personal and professional well-being. Independently develops a plan to remediate or improve limits in one's own knowledge/skills. (Level 4)

Milestone 19	Patient- and Family-Centered Communication (ICS1) Independently establishes a therapeutic relationship in challenging patient encounters. Independently recognizes personal biases while attempting to proactively minimize communication barriers. Independently uses shared decision making to make a personalized care plan. (Level 4)
Milestone 20	Interprofessional and Team Communications (ICS2) Coordinates recommendations from different members of the health care team to optimize patient care. Communicates feedback and constructive criticism to superiors. (Level 4)
Milestone 21	Communication within Health Care Systems (ICS3) Communicates clearly, concisely, and in an organized written form, including anticipatory guidance. Achieves written or verbal communication (e.g. patient notes, email) that serves as an example for others to follow. (Level 4)
